From 1st June 2004 all airlines operating at Heathrow Airport will not accept any single bag weighing more than 32kg (70lbs).

The 32kg limit on an individual bag does not affect your total baggage weight allowance, as set by your airline.

Passengers are urged to check the weight of their bag before setting off for the airport, if however you're already at the airport and your bag weighs more than 32kg you will be asked to re-pack before checking in.

Passengers who need to carry items which exceed the 32kg weight limit such as some sporting equipment, should make special arrangements with their airline in advance.

The new bag limit, supported by the Health and Safety Executive and in line with international recommendations is being brought in at Heathrow to help lessen injuries among airport staff.
